# THE MEAT

# 1. Budget Allocation and Tester Rewards

- Monthly Ad Revenue Split:
  - 50% for tester rewards.
    - What kind of tester rewards? (other than the ones listed)
  - 50% for events.
    - What kind of events?
- Tester Rewards:
  - Tester of the Month (TOTM): Rewards could be claimed via PayPal,
    Discord Nitro, or Minecraft-related items (ranks, etc.).
  - All-Time Rewards:
    - 10 tests: Raffle entry (maximum of 5 entries).
    - 40 tests: Late quota exemption.
    - 50 tests: Poll permissions (30 days).
    - 60 tests: Emoji of player's head (30 days).
    - 66 tests: Reduced cooldown for high-level testers.
    - 75 tests: Custom color role (30 days).
    - 100 tests: Emoji of choice (permanent).

# 2. Events and Engagement

#### Monthly Events:

- Examples: Karaoke, 1v1 battles, and Build Events with high-staff judges.
- Prize Options: PayPal, equivalent items, subject to change.

### Weekly Smaller Events:

- Lower prize amount, held weekly.
- Entrance fee: 35 tests per event.

#### Community Engagement:

- Active "Poll of the Day" to boost interaction.
- New "Staff Movements" channel to inform the community about staff changes.
- "Community Videos" channel to promote gameplay, requiring a link back to the Discord server or related content.

#### • Icon and Banner Themes:

 Regularly update server icon and banner to reflect seasonal or special themes.

# 3. Testing Process Improvements

### Streamlining Testing:

- Testing format shift:
  - Standard: FT5 for evaluation tests to reduce time.
    - Suggested to be a LAST resort to increase testing.
  - Exception: HT3 vs. LT3 matches should be FT7.
- Introducing bridge testing for HT3 and LT2, allowing testers to move up if they perform exceptionally well.
- Clear skip options for unresponsive or lagging participants.

#### • Tester Quota and Requirements:

- Lower entry requirements for testing, focusing on active, mature, and trustworthy individuals.
- HT3 eval testers retain exemption status if they complete HT3, T2 tests.

# 4. Motivating Testers

#### • Encouraging Participation:

- Increase tester rewards to make testing more appealing.
- Host bonding events for testers to strengthen team dynamics.
  - Who would be in charge of this?
- Reach out to other tier lists (e.g., PotPvP and SMP) for best practices in handling tester motivation and engagement.

#### 5. Server Structure and Moderation

### Role Adjustments:

- Split moderator roles into Tier List Moderators (focused on testing) and Network Moderators (focused on Discord community management).
- Assign specific high-management tasks such as website updates and guide creation.

### • Notifications and Quota Exemptions:

- Streamline quota exemptions for specific cases:
  - New testers and those who recently joined.
  - Testers who are temporarily inactive or performing high-tier evaluations.

#### Hiring Additional Staff:

- Accept more tester applications and hire trusted moderators from other tier lists.
- Regularly review tester applications to reduce wait times.

# 6. Additional Suggestions

#### • Implementing Strikes and Defenses:

- Defense: Earned when an LT2+ blocks an LT2+ candidate; three defenses allow a tester to retire.
- Strikes: LT2+ testers get a strike if they lose to LT2+ candidates; three strikes result in demotion.

#### • Optimizing Administrative Processes:

- Make staff announcements more engaging and visually appealing.
- Assign specific staff to handle tasks like evidence logging, moderation, and subhuman appeals.

# 7. Rubric Updates

#### Switching Servers Mid-Test:

- Switching servers during a tier test is prohibited without explicit approval from an admin or test regulator.
- Disregarding this rule will void the test, and repeated infractions may result in penalties, such as Tier List Cheater (TLC) designation.

#### T2+ Tests:

- Both the tester and testee must agree on a server.
- If no agreement is reached, a First To 5 (FT5) duel on both servers is recommended, provided both are verified testing servers.

If the servers are unverified, neither party is required to test on them.
 An admin or overseer may select the server if an agreement cannot be made.

#### • Low Tier Tests (Unranked through HT3 Evaluation):

 The testee has full right to select the server for Low Tier Tests, provided it is a verified testing server.

#### • T2+ Tests and HT3 Evaluation:

Both the tester and testee must mutually agree on the server.

#### 8. Use of AI

- Is there a ChatGPT discord bot or something similar?
- Can we prevent the public from using it (staff exclusive access) [should we restrict access?]
  - Could we train the bot on all tier list rules
    - Website
    - Testing Guide
    - Moderation Guide
    - Discord rules
    - Anything we can think of
  - Instead of bugging regulators and wasting time waiting for a response, we could potentially have an AI model that is trained on all tier list operations to answer questions for us.

# 9. Utilize External Softwares to Increase Efficiency

- Use Word Documents/PDFs.
- Create a PDF/Document for every tier list operation.
  - Instructions/precedents don't get lost in channels.
  - Allows everyone to be on the same page.
  - Easier transition if tasks need to be redistributed.
  - Allow regulator and above to read all documents
    - Allows high staff to understand every single operation just as the manager should.
  - o Maybe train AI on these documents too?
- Use Excel/Google Sheets for Mod/Tester apps
  - What I used for 2 years and it was amazing.
  - Way more organized.
  - Allows for easier messaging to verified servers for ban records.
  - Keeps a record of every user applied (Larger database always better).
